SPORTS IN BRITAIN – FOOTBALL

The British are the kings of game creation. The number of sports they play is **astounding**. But **football is the number 1 sport in England**. The fans love their team as their own family. Football is a hobby, a fever, a passion. It is different in England from any sport in the world. People call it 'football mad'. In the US, they call the game 'soccer', but it is not very popular there. People **also** call this sport 'footie' or 'the beautiful game'. Some people do not like the game, but the real fans read newspapers, teletext, or visit team websites in **their** free time to read news about their team.



Some of England's football teams are world famous, for example, Manchester United, Arsenal and Liverpool. In the English Football League there are 92 professional clubs. These are semi-

- 20 professional – the players usually have full-time jobs in different areas. Hundreds of thousands of people also play football in parks and playgrounds just for fun. The **highlight** of the English football year is the FA (Football Association) Cup Final every May.
- 25 The World Cup brings out the patriotism in the British. They support their national team enthusiastically. When you go to a football match, the atmosphere is incredible. There are between 25,000 to 60,000 spectators – it depends on the size of the stadium. **They** usually sell 100% of the tickets. It is difficult to buy tickets to the big games. But imagine the scene – the people watch the game and sing songs and chants. It is a spectacle to watch. Do you have an interest in sports? English
