Many people believe robots could never replace jobs that require human connection, such as doctors or teachers. Yet, technology is advancing quickly. Robots can already diagnose some illnesses more accurately than doctors, and some patients feel more comfortable talking to a machine than a person. Could this also happen in education?

British education expert Anthony Seldon believes it could. He predicts that by 2027, robots will play a major role in classrooms. **They** could deliver lessons, read students' expressions, and adapt materials to each learner. Teachers would act more like guides or assistants. However, many argue robots will never have real empathy or the emotional understanding that human teachers bring to the classroom.

Still, in regions where there are not enough teachers, robot teachers might be better than none. Around 9–16 percent of children under 14 worldwide do not attend school, and robots could help provide lessons anywhere without getting tired or stressed.

Rather than replacing teachers, robots could support them by taking over repetitive tasks such as marking homework or writing reports. Teachers often spend over 11 hours a week on non-teaching work. If robots could **handle** these duties, educators would have more time and energy to focus on inspiring, guiding, and connecting with their students.

In the intricate arena of international business, English may function as a shared linguistic medium, yet mutual intelligibility often falters on the subtler terrain of cultural expectation. The discerning professional listens, observes, and, when uncertain, inquires (D).

Likewise, direct eye contact can alternately suggest sincerity, defiance, or impropriety depending on geography and gender.
